The following classes will be offered, divided by sex:

REGULAR CLASSES

6-9 Month Junior Puppy, 9-12 Month Senior Puppy, 12-18 Months, Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor, Open, Veterans (7-10 years, 10-13 years, 13 plus years).

Field (Working Dog) - for dogs that have attained a Regular CKC Earthdog Title, i.e. JE, GJE, SE GSE, ME, GMEX - these dogs do not compete for Winners, but the first place Male/Female from this class shall compete for Best of Breed.

Following Best of Breed judging, the first place male/female from the Field Class will compete for Best Working (unless it is automatic).

The first place male/female from each Veterans Class do not compete for Winners, but shall compete for Best of Breed. Following Best of Breed, the first place male/female from each Veterans Class will then compete for Best Veteran and Best of Opposite Sex to Best Veteran unless it is automatic.

NON REGULAR CLASSES - Dogs entered in a Non Regular Class must also be entered in one of the CKC Regular Classes or for Exhibition Only (with the exception of the Baby Puppy Class).

Baby Puppy Class - Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months on the date of the show. Both male and female baby puppies will be judged prior to the judging of other regular classes. Puppies in this category may not compete in any regular or non-regular class. Baby Puppy Class will be judged prior to the judging of other official classes.

Stud Dog Class shall be for Stud Dog and two of his get.

Brood Bitch Class shall be for Brood Bitch and two of her progeny.

PRIZES

Through the generosity of friends and members, Border Terrier Canada is pleased to offer prizes and/or rosettes for the following: Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Winners, Best Puppy in Breed, Select Dog, Select Bitch, Winners Dog, Winners Bitch, Reserve Winners Dog, Reserve Winners Birth, Best Veteran, Best of Opposite Sex Veteran, Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Working (Field) Dog, Working (Field) bitch, Best, Best Working and all class winners in the regular and non-regular classes.

NOTE: The winners of the Working (Field) Dog and Working (Field) Bitch classes will compete for Best Working and the Anna Fraser Memorial Award. This award is in memory of founding member J. Anna Fraser who wholeheartedly shared our belief that "essentially a working terrier" were more than just words in the standard.

Award of Merit: At the judge's discretion, a prize and rosette may be offered for every TEN dogs competing at the Best of Breed level. This award will be made after the judging of Best of Breed.

Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Awards of Merit, Select Dog and Select Bitch awarded at the National Specialty, qualify your dog to go to the Crufts Dog Show in Birmingham, UK.

AWARDS AND TROPHY FUND - Donations are gratefully accepted. All donations received prior to closing date will be listed in our Specialty Catalogue. Inquiries may be made to: Shawna Froese. Cheques should be made payable to Border Terrier Canada.

SWEEPSTAKES CLASSES - All classes divided by sex:

All dogs entered in Sweepstakes must be entered in one of the official classes at the specialty.

This specialty will include PUPPY/JUVENILE AND VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES as follows: Puppy/Juvenile Sweepstakes: 4-6 months, 6-9 months, 9-12 months, 12-18 months on the day of the specialty.

Veteran Sweepstakes: 7-10 years, 10-13 years, 13 plus years on the day of the specialty.

PRIZES: PUPPY AND VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

- First in each class 50% of entry fee for that class.
- Rosette and 15% for Best in Sweepstakes, Rosette and 10% for Best of Opposite in Sweepstakes.
- Balance of 25% will be retained for Administration.

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

Chapter 15, Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be provided hereunder.

Chapter 15, Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the num er of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

* Dogs Competing	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10-12	13 & more
Points Allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

^{*} Includes the dog awarded winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

CONFORMATION SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

Chapter 4, Section 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

Chapter 19, Section 19.7. It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club b to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the

CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it dems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show which will be governed by CKC rules.

Border Terrier Canada will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume liability in the event of accident, or other misfortunes, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.

If because of riot, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of Border Terrier Canada, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of Entry will be made.

The show precincts shall consist of all areas set out for rings, shelters or facilities set aside for show officials, judges, exhibitors and handlers and an area of 30 feet outside of the judging rings.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Following the judging of the specialty, we will be offering the Best Otter Head Class. This competition is free of charge and open to any dog entered in the Specialty. Our judge, Jayne Alpe will select which Border Terrier among those present has the most typical "Otter Head". A Rosette and trophy will be awarded.

JUNIOR HANDLING

Friday, May 31, 2024 Held under CKC Rules - Judge: Mrs. Carole Dean Entry Fee - \$2.00

All dogs must be entered in one of the Official Classes or Exhibition Only at the Border Terrier Canada National Specialty. Entry to be made at the show. A prize and rosette will be awarded for Best Overall Junior Handler. Rosettes will be awarded for 1st in each class.

PARADE OF VERSATILITY TITLE HOLDERS (POV)

Friday, May 31, 2024
Following Junior Handling Judging

- Our fourth annual Parade of Versatility Title holders will showcase the versatility of the Border Terrier. To be eligible for this event, a dog or bitch must have earned the BTC Versatility Title or Versatility Excellent Title and be owned or co-owned by a BTC member. A commemorative Rosette will be offered for Parade of Versatility Title Holders.
- For more information on qualifying for this title, go to the Border Terrier Canada website.
- To be entered in the parade, a dog must be entered in a regular Specialty class or for Exhibition Only as well as the Parade of Versatility.
- Entry fee for the Parade of Versatility is \$15.00. Please indicate POV on your entry form or if using the Entry Line to enter, select POV as your class. You must also complete the form on our BTC website Specialty Web Page. NOTE: Deadline for submission of the forms for the Parade will be March 15th. The actual entry fee can be paid along with regular entries prior to closing.

All fees are payable at time of entry. No entry will be processed or entered in this show without payment and must be received by the Show Secretary by the closing date and time. Incomplete entries will be returned. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom entries were made. To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the show secretary after the closing date/time. Only dogs eligible for CKC registration may enter this show. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.

TCN fees are payable with the entry fee for dogs that do not have their Individual registration number at closing date. Official CKC entry forms must be used.

No postdated cheques accepted. All NSF cheques will be subject to a charge of \$20.00. NSF cheques are considered non-payment of entry fees and are punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. Overpayment of entries will be considered a donation to Border Terrier Canada.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors: Pease note that fees are due and payable in Canadian Dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Your cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) - Effective January 1, 2023

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN.

There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN.

TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone to obtain a number.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign-born and foreign-owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Events Registration Number (ERN) from the Canadian Kennel Club.

BORDER TERRIER CANADA ROOM RESPONSIBILITY POLICY

(Adapted with Permission From The Border Terrier Club of America Room Policy)

Border Terrier Canada (BTC) has adopted the following rules in order to ensure that its members and their dogs will be welcome at hotels in the future. Any individual attending a Border Terrier Canada (BTC) sanctioned event and staying in a hotel, motel, inn or campsite/fairground has the responsibility of leaving that room or campsite exactly as found. This includes picking up after dog(s) on the grounds. Anyone who damages a room or campsite/fairground and does not report the damage to the hotel/campsite/fairground management, and make immediate restitution or arrangements to do so within a period of time agreed upon by the management, will be subject to any or all of the following actions by the BTC Board of Directors.

- 1. May be banned from showing at the next BTC sanction event(s).
- 2. May be subject to CKC sanctions.
- 3. Membership in the BTC may be terminated and may not be allowed to be reinstated. Damages shall be defined as:
- 1. Flea infestation, urine, defecation and/or any damage to hotel/caMpsite/fairground property (walls, bedspreads, carpets, drapes, etc).
- 2. Any verified complaint by the host hotel/campsite/fairground.
- 3. Any verified complaint by a BTC member.

BTC Room Regulations:

- 1. All dogs shall be crated and quiet when left alone in a room. Noisy dogs shall be quieted upon request, even if this means the owner/handler must stay in the room with the dog.
- 2. Individuals will be expected to immediately report any damage by dogs or themselves to the hotel or campsite/fairground management, and to assume complete financial responsibility for those damages.
- 3. No bathing or grooming will be allowed in rooms. A grooming area will be available whenever possible.
- 4. Dogs are to be allowed on hotel furniture/beds ONLY if the furniture is covered with protective covering provided by the owner/handler.

5. All owners/handlers will take preventative measures to assure that their dogs are free of fleas, mites, intestinal parasites and other communicable diseases prior to arriving at the hotel/campsite.
