Classifications:

Junior Puppy Dogs between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show

Senior Puppy Dogs between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show

12 -18 Months Dogs between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show

Canadian Bred Dogs born in Canada; Champions of any country are excluded

Bred by Exhibitor Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder for this class, but breeder need not handle the dog for further awards.

Open Class For all dogs

Veterans Class For all dogs over 7 years of age on day of show. These dogs do compete for regular placements and the winner of this class will go on to compete for BEST OF BREED (they do not compete for Winners). Dogs in this class maybe spayed or neutered.

Specials Only For dogs who are Canadian Champions. A CKC Registration Number, ERN or MSC Number must be indicated on the entry form at time of closing.

NON-REGULAR & UNOFFICIAL CLASSES

In order for a dog to be entered in any Non-Regular or Unofficial class, dogs must also be entered in a Regular class or for Exhibition Only. Dogs may be spayed or neutered

Baby Puppy Dogs between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. These puppies are not eligible to compete for championship points.

Exhibition Only Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes

Exhibition Only (4-6 Months)

Puppies 4-6 months of age may be entered in Exhibition Only 4-6 Months provided the owner(s) has entered a dog in a Regular Official Class. and two or more of his get. Stud Dog may be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition only. Get must be entered in a Regular class.

STUD DOG & GET - Stud Dog and two or more of his get. Get must be entered in the regular classes. The stud must be entered in regular classes or exhibition only.

DAM & PROGENY - Dam and two or more of her Progeny. Progeny must be entered in the regular classes. The brood bitch must be entered in regular classes or exhibition only.

Brace Two dogs not necessarily of the same sex or owner. Must be handled by one person on one lead and should be judged as an identical pair. Dogs may be spayed/neutered

Junior Showmanship Competition

Handlers must show a Dachshund but do not have to own the dog

Held under CKC Rules and Regulations and as printed in the show catalogue

Saturday October 7, 2023 After the Specialty

Entries to be taken up to 1 hour prior to this event. There will be a \$2.00 fee which will be collected at the show

Junior handling is open to all persons from ages 4 up to 18 years of age on the date of competition. All Dogs must also be entered in the regular classes at the all-breed show, but need not be owned by the junior or any of his immediate family.

A rosette and suitable prize will be awarded to the winners of First in each class, rosette will be given to 2nd through 4th in each class. Peewee handlers will receive a Participant ribbon and prize. A rosette and prize will be offered for Best Overall.

CLASSES

Pee Wee Class (Unofficial Class): This class is for handlers 4 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 7th birthday. This class is optional and non-competitive. No placements are to be awarded; only participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.

Junior Novice Class :This class is for handlers 7 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date their 11th birthday who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition

Junior Open: This class is for handlers 7 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 11th birthday who have won 6 first places with competition.

Intermediate Novice: This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.

Intermediate Open This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have won 6 first places with competition and for any handler who has progressed through the Junior Open level and feels that they have enough experience to compete at this level.

Senior Novice: This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have not won 6 first places with competition in this class. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class

Senior Open This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have won 6 first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class, and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that they have enough experience to compete at this level.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Dogs should be at the show site at least one hour prior to ring time. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the posted schedule and be at ringside at the time of judging. The club will not call individual dogs to ringside. Please remain at ringside until judging is completed. Exhibitors must clean up after their dogs, anyone found not doing so will be excused from the show or trial. Exhibitors are reminded to respect hospitality facilities. The Club reserves the right to refuse future entries from any exhibitor who creates excessive destructive or disruption to host facilities (Hotel, motel, or campground). The show superintendent is in complete charge of the shows and trials which are governed by CKC rules. No judge or any other person participating in any capacity at a dog show held under CKC rules shall be subjected to an indignity of any kind during the progress of the show. The Show Committee has a responsibility to see that this rule is enforced. Chapter 19.7, Page 55, CKC Conformation Show Rules and Regulations. The Dog Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs, exhibitors, and spectators, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune. The Club and the specialty club reserves the right to remove from the shows or trials any person or dog for any just cause. Any dog excused by the show superintendent or veterinarian, for any reason, shall not compete in any classes or accept any awards for the duration of the shows or trials. **No refund of any fees will be made.**

REGULATIONS

1. Dog Show Rule books and Obedience Trial regulations are available from the Canadian Kennel Club.
2. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC rules. All rules and regulations, as outlined in the Red Deer & District Kennel Club premium list, will also apply to this specialty.
3. Entries will be acknowledged by email after entry closing, with receipt, judging schedule and exhibitor passes. If such acknowledgement is not received one week before the show date, please contact the Show Secretary.
4. "It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities" – CKC rule book, Section 19.7
5. We welcome all exhibitors and spectators, including persons with disabilities. If you require accommodation of a disability, please make your accommodation known to the club in advance. Please contact the show secretary by entry closing to ensure that we can do our best to accommodate your needs.

WITHDRAWAL OF ENTRIES

Please note: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone, but written or electronic notification must be received by the Show Secretary no later than the official closing date and time. If written notification is not received by that time, the dog will remain entered in the show.

Extracts From CKC Dog Show Rules

Chapter 8 Entries and End of Show Section 8.2.5 An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

Section 8.3.1 Entries: Every dog entered in a Championship show must be one of the following:

- a) registered with the CKC,
- b) have an Event Registration Number,
- c) be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d) if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

Section 8.4.1 Temporary Competition Numbers or (TCN) Dogs: If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a TCN dog provided:

- b) that if born in Canada, it is eligible for individual registration.
- c) that if not born in Canada, is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC.
- d) that if it is a foreign born and owned dog, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

Section 8.4.2 Entry of a TCN dog at a show must be accompanied by a TCN fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.

Section 8.5.1 Acceptance of Entries: If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.

Section 8.5.3 No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred, or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for pure bred dogs.

Section 8.5.4 After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled, or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in case of a postal strike.

Section 8.6.1 Refusal of Entries: The authorities of any show may:

- a) decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
- b) refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness.
- c) in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.

Section 8.8.2 Fees: Tendering of a dishonored cheque or declined credit card in payment of an entry fee shall be considered non-payment of said fee and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

Section 8.9.1 Moving a Dog to Specials: A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a Championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for a show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to the opening of the show.

Section 8.9.2 If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the Championship requirements, all awards will be canceled, and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.

Section 8.9.3 When one or more All-Breed and/or Specialty Shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the moving of class dogs to Specials must be made prior to the scheduled opening of the first show.

Chapter 4 Judges Section 4.1.3 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Section 4.1.6 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act.

Chapter 14 Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs Section 14.1.2

(a) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to excuse or disqualify a dog which menaces, threatens, attempts to bite or bites the judge, another person, or another dog in the ring. When a dog is twice excused on this account, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog.

(b) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to permanently disqualify a dog which bites the judge or another person in the ring. Dogs disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the Judge's Disqualification Form.

Section 14.1.4 Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. A dog disqualified under section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.

Section 14.1.5 Any dog that is disqualified under section 14.1.2(a) shall automatically be disqualified from entering in any CKC event in any other discipline until such time as the dog is officially reinstated, if the dog is eligible for reinstatement.

Attention US Exhibitors: Current exchange rate favors the American dollar. To take full advantage of this, please purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they must be payable in US funds, and for the full amount of the entry. Please do not mark personal cheques payable in Canadian fund, or "at par" as such items are not readily cleared through the bank. Your co-operation is appreciated.

ATTENTION: ALL FOREIGN EXHIBITORS - ERN NUMBERS All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an event registration number (ERN). This ERN number does not register a dog with the CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act, but rather enables a foreign owned dog to be awarded titles by the CKC. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN number, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with a cheque or VISA/Mastercard number, (expiry date, cardholders name and signature). Provide your complete address for return of ERN number. ERN number must be applied for within 30 DAYS of the FIRST day of entering a CKC event.

Temporary Competition Numbers or (TCN) – A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event and the same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a (Performance Event Number) PEN or (Canine Companion Number) CCN. While there is no fee to obtain a TCN, exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN fees (formerly called listing fees) when entering events using this number. The process of obtaining a TCN will be self-serve; exhibitors will be directed to the CKC website to complete an online application and a TCN will be issued instantly upon completion. Exhibitors may also obtain a TCN by completing a printed application and submitting it to the CKC by mail, or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division by telephone.

Please note that if your dog does not have a registration number or ERN and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, score, or awards, there is no need to apply for a TCN. CKC records will be updated accordingly.

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of the Red Deer & District Kennel Club if it: Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease; Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or any other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to event) Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or any other communicable disease.

The Red Deer & District Kennel Club has the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.
