CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION #1. A dog awarded WINNERS at a Championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5), and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder.

SECTION #2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows;

To determine the number of points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all dogs in competition which were defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with 5 points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified or that is dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge, shall not be included in the calculation for championship points (Absentees are not to be included). In order for a dog to be recognized as a Canadian Champion it must: (1) earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; (2) a two point win awarded either at the breed or group level; and (3) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs entered in an Unofficial class must also be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only.

A Listing Fee of \$8.82 (per day) must accompany the entry if a CKC INDIVIDUAL REGISTRATION NUMBER. ERN or PEN NUMBER does not appear on the entry form.

Conformation Classifications

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered

<u>JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS</u> - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

<u>SENIOR PUPPY CLASS</u> - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

<u>12 to 18 MONTH CLASS</u> - For dogs 12 months & under 18 months on the day of this Specialty

<u>CANADIAN BRED CLASS</u> - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring owner/breeder. The handler **MUST** be the owner/co-owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs

<u>SPECIALS ONLY CLASS</u> - This class shall be for any dog, which has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. <u>Note</u>: A Listed dog <u>MAY</u> be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class <u>MUST</u> be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. Listing Fees <u>WILL NOT</u> be refunded

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class <u>MAY NOT COMPETE</u> in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

ADDITIONAL REGULAR SPECIALTY CLASSES

The following additional regular classes will be offered at this Specialty:

<u>BABY PUPPY CLASS -</u> This class shall be for any dog 3 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. (note: winners of these classes DO NOT COMPETE FOR POINTS). <u>The class will be judged after Best</u> <u>Puppy in Specialty</u>

<u>VETERANS CLASS</u> - For dogs 7 years of age and older on the day of this Show. Dogs entered in this class DO NOT COMPETE FOR POINTS (*This class will be divided into 2 age divisions – 7 to 10yrs and 10+ yrs. Winners of each class will carry through to compete for Best of Breed*) *PLEASE NOTE: SPAYED OR NEUTERED DOGS MAY COMPETE IN THIS CLASS*

ADDITIONAL NON-REGULAR/UNOFFICIAL SPECIALTY CLASSES

The following unofficial/non-regular classes will be offered at this Specialty:

<u>FIELD DOG CLASS</u> – shall be for a dog of either sex which has received a placement, Certificate of Merit or a judge's Award of Merit in an official class in a licensed Field Trial in Canada or the USA. Or which has received a Field Test pass or title under the rules of the CKC or an AKC Hunt test pass or title. Winner does not complete for Best of Breed.

BRACE CLASS - Shall be for two dogs

<u>SIRE & GET</u> - Shall comprise the Sire and two or more of his Get (Note: Get <u>MUST</u> be entered in a Regular class)

DAM & PROGENY - Shall have all the same requirements as the Sire & Get Class (Note: Progeny **MUST** be entered in a Regular class

SWEEPSTAKES

All dogs entered in sweepstakes MUST also be entered in a regular class. Spayed and neutered dogs may compete in Veterans Sweepstakes provided they are also entered in Exhibition Only. Sweepstakes will be held immediately before the regular classes:

Classes will be:

Juvenile: Baby Puppy (3-6 months), Junior (6-9 months); Senior (9-12 months); (12 - 18 months)

Veteran (7-10 years), Veteran (10 years +)

All first place winners from each Puppy class will compete for Best Puppy in Sweepstakes and Runner up. All first place winners from each Veteran class will compete for Best Veteran in Sweepstakes and Runner Up. A rosette will be awarded for Best Puppy in Sweepstakes, Best Veteran in Sweepstakes and Runner up to Best in Sweepstakes in each of Puppy and Veteran.

Prize Money

Best in each class: 50% of the entry fees collected for that class in either Puppy or Veteran

Best Puppy or Veteran in Sweepstakes- 25% of total entry fees in either Puppy or Veteran classes

25% of the total entry fee shall be retained by the Club for administrative purposes.

Rosettes will be offered for 1^{st} through 4^{th} in each class including Sweepstakes.

EXTRACTS FROM THE CONFORMATION SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

CHAPTER 4.1.3 - JUDGES

A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show, and it shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see this rule is effectively enforced.

CHAPTER 8 - ENTRIES and ENTRY FEES

Section 8.3.1

Every dog entered in Championship Shows held under these rules must be registered, have an Event Registration Number, eligible for registration with the CKC or have a CKC Miscellaneous Class Certification number issued by the CKC Chief Registrar. If a dog is not registered individually in the CKC it may be entered at a show, held under these rules, as a "listed" dog, provided

(a) it is not a Miscellaneous breed

(b) if born in Canada, is eligible for individual registration

(c) if foreign born and owned, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

A listing fee of \$8.82 must accompany the entry of a "listed" dog at a show held under these rules.

Section 8.2.

INCOMPLETE ENTRIES

Entry forms which are incomplete or those that contain incorrect information after the closing date of entries will be void and under no circumstances can changes be made. Any dog taking a win resulting from such an entry will result in the wins being cancelled. **Section 8.6.2**:

DISHONORED CHEQUES

Tendering of a dishonored cheque or credit card in payment of entry fees shall be considered non-payment of entry fees.Clubs may refuse to accept entries from any exhibitor who have been known to tender dishonored cheques in payment of entry fees

unless such entries are accompanied by a money order, cash or certified cheque.

CHAPTER 14 - DISQUALIFICATION

Section 14.1.4

A dog once disqualified for any reason at a Championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown or entered at a show held under these rules unless and until said dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of said dog is subject to disciplinary action. Note: for any further information on reinstatement refer to Chapter 14, Section 3 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations

CHAPTER 5 – SHOW OFFICIALS

Section 5.1.5

A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent.
