New number system for dogs entering shown as "Listed"

Temporary Competition Number (TCN), replacing Listing: TCNs will replace the current system of entering events with 'Listed dogs', and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). The current TCN fee is \$10.50 per entry:

NOTE: No post or 'phone' entries accepted. No postdated cheques accepted. Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by payment. Payment can be made in either US or Canadian funds. <u>USD accepted at par.</u> We would encourage all entrants to enter using <u>www.dogshow.ca</u> website. Please check that your information is correct on the website. There is no charge to join dogshow.ca.

Listing fee: A listing fee as established by The Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) must accompany the entry of a dog for which a CKC individual registration number or Event Registration Number (ERN) is not shown on the entry form.

Non-Member Participation Fee: A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual. In order for the title to awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pat the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted; howver, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US Dollars, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques, 'Payable in Canadian Funds,' or, 'At Par'. They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts of money orders payable in Canadian funds.

Please ensure all RABIES shots are up-to-date.

HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

The Eastern Slopes Spaniel Association (ESSA) will be following all British Columbia CMOH Orders, guidance and protocols during the October 13 and 14, 2023 Spaniel Hunt tests.

It is expected that all participants comply with these conditions. ESSA will circulate any restrictions at closing via dogshow.ca

ESSA would like to thank everyone in advance for their cooperation in helping make this a safe and successful event.



HUNT TESTS OFFERED

Working Spaniel

A working Spaniel must show a desire to hunt in an interesting and enthusiastic manner and demonstrate an ability to retrieve.

Dogs should show no fear of ground or type of cover, respond reasonably well to whistle, verbal and hand commands and maintain a reasonable working distance from their handler.

The Working Spaniel must find, flush and tretrieve two (2) birds on land. Steadiness is not required. Furthermore, the dog must retrieve one (1) bird from water by swimming a minimum distance of 20 meters and a maximum of 40 meters. The dogs should deliver the birds within a one (1) meter radius from the handler. At the water, the dog can be restrained by a leash and sent only at the Judge's direction. Dogs which are gun-shy or show no interest or ability to hunt are unacceptable and should be disqualified.

Junior Hunt Test

A Junior Hunting Spaniel must show all the attributes of a working Spaniel. In addition, the dog must show boldness to all types of cover encountered, have a definite quartering pattern and an intense desire to hunt within gun range.

The Junior Hunting Spaniel must find, flush and retrieve two (2) birds on land. Steadiness to wing and shot are not required, however, the dog must not chase uncontrollably. The dog must retrieve one (1) bird from water in a crosswind by swimming a minimum distance of 25 meters and a maximum distance of 50 meters. All birds must be delivered to hand. The dog must be line steady at the water and wait to be sent at the Judge's direction.

Senior Hunt Test

A Senior Hunting Spaniel must clearly show all the attributes of a Junior Hunting Spaniel. At this level, the dog must show a very polished quartering pattern that covers the ground in an intense and independent fashion. The dog must be steady to wing and shot and be line steady. The dog must also show that it is using the wind to locate birds and flush without encouragement.

The Senior Hunting Spaniel must find and flush three (3) birds and retrieve a minimum of two (2) birds on land. The dog must also be capable of retrieving one (1) bird from water in a downwind or crosswind by swimming a minimum of 50 meters and a maximum of 75 meters.

The dog must complete two (2) single blind retrieves in a downwind or crosswind; one (1) on land at a minimum of 50 meters and a maximum of 75 meters, and one (1) from water by swimming a minimum distance of 30 meters and a maximum distance of 50 meters.

The Senior Hunting Spaniel must be sent only at the Judge's direction and all birds must be delivered to hand.

Master Hunt Test

A Master Hunting Spaniel must not only show all the positive attributes of the Senior Hunting Spaniel, but be capable of hunting adjacent to another dog (bracework) and honor it bracemate when required (i.e. steadiness to wing and shot and during it's bracemate's retrieve)

The Master Hunting Spaniel must show intelligent use of wind, show the ability to track, be prepared to handle all types of cover and terrain, and be under complete control at all times. Interfering with it's bracemate and hunting out of control are faults worthy of disqualification.

In the interest of safety, a centerline must be indicated as terrain dictates.

The Master Hunting Spaniel must find and flush three (3) birds with at least two (2) retrieves. All shot birds must be retrieved. The dog must also be able to retrieve one (1) bird from water in a downwind or crosswind by swimming 50-75 meters.

The Master Hunting Spaniel must complete a downwind blind land retrieve at a minimum of 75 meters and a maximum distance of 100 meters plus a downwind blind water retrieve by swimming a minimum distance of 35 meters and a maximum distance of 50 meters.

In addition, the dog must complete a double retrieve. It must be seated (hupped) approximately 10 meters from the water's edge. A shot is fired and the first bird is thrown into cover on land at a minimum distance of 50 meters and a maximum distance of 75 meters. Another shot is fired, and the second bird is thrown into the water at a minimum distance of 35 meters and a maximum distance of 50 meters. A minimum of five (5) decoys, anchored separately, should be set on the water in proximity of the line to be followed. At the Judge's direction the dog is sent. The Handler shall decide which retrieve is to be completed first. All retrieves must be completed and delivered to hand.

Water Test

The Water Test will be conducted in a manner that the bird will be thrown from shore using a mechanical devise or from a boat.
