There will be munchies available to purchase at the trial. Fast Food and Grocery stores are available within a short driving distance from the trial site in Morinville.

Agility Classes Descriptions and/or Changes

Regular Classes: These classes are open to all dogs, 18 months of age or older, as described within the current rules of the Agility Association of Canada.

Specials Classes: These classes are open to all dogs but are intended for dogs that are of a size or stature which limits their jumping ability. A dog may no longer compete in Regular classes after being entered at an official trial in any Specials class level, except that they may move to Veterans.

Veterans Classes: These classes shall be for dogs seven (7) years of age or older that are currently competing in any Regular Class and for dogs five (5) years of age or older who have competed in the Specials Class level for a minimum of twelve (12) months.

Starters Games Classes: Effective January 1, 2009, moving out of Starters Games classes into Advanced now requires two (2) qualifying scores under two (2) different judges.

Advanced Games Classes: Effective January 1, 2009, the Advanced Games classes are open to dogs that have earned two (2) qualifying scores in a particular Starters level game under two (2) different judges. Moving out of Advanced now requires three (3) qualifying scores under two (2) different judges.

Masters Games Classes: The Masters Games classes are open to dogs that have completed three (3) qualifying scores at the Advanced level for a particular game under two (2) different judges.

Standard Class: The Standard Class shall be for dogs that have not earned the associated standard title for their level (ADC, AADC, or MADC). A dog must achieve three (3) qualifying scores (no course or time faults) under two (2) different judges in their respective level, at an AAC Sanctioned Trial, to be awarded the Standard class title (ADC, AADC, or MADC).

Gamblers Class: This game demonstrates the handler's strategy and the dog's ability to work at a distance from the handler. The object of the game is to accumulate as many points as possible during the opening sequence and successfully complete the gamble.

Jumpers Class: This game demonstrates a dog's natural jumping ability.

Snooker Class: This game demonstrates the handler and dog's versatility as they work together against the clock. The object of the game is to accumulate as many points as possible in the opening and closing sequences within the allotted time.

Team Class: Effective January 1, 2010 Team Relay is now a single-level class with a title structure equivalent to Steeplechase. This is a time plus 5 fault event where a maximum of 5 Faults shall be permitted for a qualifying score if the time plus faults score is equal to or less than the SCT determined by the judge.

Steeplechase: This game demonstrates the dog's ability to run and jump at high speeds while maintaining control on the A-Frame and weave poles. This is a time plus faults event where the combined time-plus-faults score must be equal to or less than the SCT as determined by the judge.

AAC Challenge: Effective July 1, 2009 Challenge will be open to dogs competing at the Masters level in Standard classes. Required equipment will be the same as in Standard courses with the possible addition of the table and/or broad jump, but course design will emphasize more technical handling challenges than would be seen in a Standard or Steeplechase class. Standard course time will be determined after each height class runs by multiplying the fastest clean-run time achieved in that height class by 1.2.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of AAC rules and regulations, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.

This event will be held in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Agility Association of Canada (AAC). All equipment conforms to AAC Standards. Competitors should be familiar with the rules and dogs must be comfortable on each piece of equipment (winged jumps, non-winged jumps, spread jump, double jump, tire jump (breakaway tire), pause table, A-frame, dog walk, teeter, weave poles, flexible tunnels and collapsible tunnels [chutes]). Please note: electronic timing will/can be used.

All breeds and mixed breeds, eighteen (18) months of age and older, are eligible to compete. Blind, lame or aggressive dogs are ineligible, as are bitches in season.

A dog demonstrating aggression toward any person or any dog, inside or outside the ring, will be excused from the trial. Any dog that the judge feels is not in enough control to perform all obstacles in a safe manner will be excused from the trial.

ALL DOGS MUST HAVE AN AAC ID CARD AND NUMBER TO COMPETE IN AN AAC TRIAL. If your dog does not yet have an AAC ID card, please fill out the registration form from the AAC website, www.aac.ca, and mail it to AAC.

THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS, CANCELLATIONS, OR CHANGES AFTER THE CLOSING DATE. A dog that has entered this trial and subsequently earns a title shall be permitted to move up in a class providing the Trial Secretary is notified by telephone at least one (1) week prior to the date of the trial. The Trial Secretary must be notified before the trial date by a competitor whose bitch comes into season or whose dog is injured, and a valid veterinarian certificate (containing the name of the clinic, address, phone number, and vet's signature) must be provided prior to any refund being issued. Refunds for any other reasons may or may not be given at the Trial Committee's discretion. Please note that there will be a \$10.00 administrative fee per dog will be applied to any refund request received after the closing date. There will be a \$10 charge for NSF cheques.

Please check your entry before sending to ensure all required information has been completed, including dog's ID number, class and correct jump height. Incomplete entries will not be considered to be valid. The "General Agreement" form" must be signed in order to comply with AAC's acceptance to this trial. Please provide email addresses as we wish to electronically send confirmation where possible.

No leashes, collars, toys, food or other training devices shall be allowed on course. The leash and collar must be removed and given to the Ring Steward or designee at the start of a run. Dogs must be kept under control at all times and must be penned, crated, or leashed when not competing. Competitors are required to supply their own chairs and crates/pens for benching.

Please take responsibility for your dogs and children. Any competitor whose dogs, children or person create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour can be dismissed from the trial site by the Trial Committee.

Competitors **MUST** keep crate and exercise areas clean. Please clean up after yourselves and your dogs. Anyone who does not do this may be excused from the trial site by the Trial Committee and no refund will be given.

K9 Korruption will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog exhibited, or for the possessions of any competitor whether the result was by accident or any other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this event is in the care and custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the trial site. Any competitor whose dog and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee be asked to leave the trial site.

There will be no refunds for any dog or competitor dismissed from the trial for any reason.
