# TWO CKC LICENSED FIELD DOG JUNIOR TESTS SATURDAY, AUGUST 24, 2024



The Northern Alberta Pointing Dog Club (NAPDC) will conduct two CKC licensed FIELD DOG JUNIOR (FDJ) tests for all pointing breeds near Buck Lake, Alberta on Saturday, August 24, 2024. A dog requires three qualifying scores to be awarded the title of Field Dog Junior). NAPDC is offering two tests on one day to support dogs and handlers in achieving that title.

The tests will be held under the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club, 5397 Eglinton Avenue, W, Suite 101, Etobicoke, ON M9C 5K6.

#### **Description of FDJ test**

The purpose of field tests for pointing breeds is to provide an opportunity to demonstrate a dog's ability in the field. As described in the CKC Rules, a Field Dog Junior is a dog that has not reached the training level of a field dog. FDJ is an entry level test for dogs of any age that have limited field experience. The test assesses the natural hunting abilities for which pointing dogs were originally bred, against a standard of performance that includes desire to hunt, style of running, pace, range, pattern, control, pointing and reaction to shot (blank pistol only at the FDJ level).

**Location:** A map showing the location of the grounds will be provided to entrants at the time the running order is distributed. We ask for your co-operation in keeping the grounds free of litter. Parking will be marked. There is no overnight camping. All persons entering the test grounds are required to sign a waiver of liability, available through dogshow.ca, prior to entering or engaging in any activities on the grounds.

#### **General Information:**

- Entries: Entries will be accepted starting at 6:00pm, Monday, August 12, 2024. They will close when the tests are full <u>or</u> on Monday, August 19, 2024 6:00pm, whichever occurs first.
- Entry fee: \$70 per dog per test. For example, one dog entered in two tests: \$70 X 2 = \$140.00.
- Total number of entries will be limited to the number of dogs that can be tested in the allotted time. We expect to start the first test Saturday morning no later than 9:00am. The second test will start immediately after the first test is completed. The times may be adjusted when the entries numbers are known.

- **Starting times:** Will be confirmed after the entries are closed and a running order is set. It is the handler's responsibility to be at the start of the course when it is their turn to run. As necessary, we may depart from the published running order as the test day progresses.
- **Prizes:** Rosettes will be awarded to all dogs receiving qualifying scores.
- Rules: All participants must be familiar with CKC Rules and Regulations and also the rules, conditions and provisions of this Premium List. CKC Field Test Rules are available online from the CKC:

- In Season Bitches: Bitches in season will only be allowed to run at the end of the second test.
- Collaring: Collaring a dog is allowed with the permission of the judge
- **Tracking Collars:** Tracking collars that meet the CKC guidelines will be allowed. Participants must declare that they are using the tracking collars to the Field Test chair and the judges.
- Training or exercising: Training or exercising of dogs is prohibited on the test grounds during the test day,
- Smoking: Is prohibited except in your parked vehicles. NO OPEN FIRES WILL BE ALLOWED.
- Accommodation: There is no camping at the test site.
- **Hospitality:** Lunch will be provided for judges and volunteers. It will be available to others in exchange for a contribution to the NAPDC donation jar.
- Please note: No filming or video taping of this event is permitted without the express permission of the Field Test Committee. No footage obtained may be used for commercial purposes or for posting on any social media sites.
- Entries: Entries will open starting at 6:00pm, Monday, August 12, 2024. They will close when the tests are full or on Monday, August 19, 2024 at 6:00pm, whichever occurs first. Draw will follow after closing at the home of the Test Secretary. Online entries through <a href="www.dogshow.ca">www.dogshow.ca</a> are preferred. Paper entries must be sent to the Test Secretary who may be contacted at <a href="jbatrack@gmail.com">jbatrack@gmail.com</a> for further instructions. Payment in full must accompany all entries.
- TCN Number: (Previously Listing fees) A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) as established by The Canadian Kennel Club and MUST ACCOMPANY the entry of a dog for which a Canadian Kennel Club individual registration number or Event Registration Number (ERN) is not shown on the entry form. This fee is \$10.50 (including GST) per dog per each event entered during the field test and is in addition to the entry fee(s). Exhibitors should be aware that the CKC does not confer a title on any dog until it is registered individually in their records. Please visit www.CKC.ca to obtain a TCN.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the Test-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to indignities of any kind.

All entries for this Field Test are accepted on condition that the NAPDC, its officials and members, and land owners, are released from all liabilities for loss, damage or injury sustained by dog, horse or person in conjunction with, or during the running of, this Field Test. All minors shall be under the direct care and supervision of the parent or guardian. Signed waivers will be required from all persons present for the tests. Waiver forms will be available on the day of the test.
