ENTRY FEES: \$55.00 per dog per test (PLEASE NOTE: each day is a separate test)

Payable in cash, cheque or money order (in Canadian funds) to **The Calgary Pointing Dog Club (CPDC)**

LISTING FEE: A listing fee as established by The Canadian Kennel Club must accompany the entry of a dog for which a Canadian Kennel Club individual registration number or Event Registration Number (ERN) is not shown on the entry form. This listing fee is \$8.93 per dog per each event entered during the field test and is in addition to the entry fee(s). Exhibitors should be aware that the CKC does not confer a title on any dog until it is registered individually in their records.

Entries should be submitted to the Field Test Secretary **between Monday May 9, 2017 at 9:00 am and Tuesday May 23, 2017 at 6:00 pm.** Running order will be drawn following the close of entries. Running order will be emailed to handlers on Wednesday May 24, 2017.

The test secretary will acknowledge the receipt of all electronic entries.

NOTE: In the case of electronic or telephone entries, the entry is not considered complete until fee is paid and a signed entry form is received by the Test Secretary. All completed entry forms must be in the hands of the Field Test Secretary and entry fees paid in full before a dog will be allowed to run.

<p>All entries for the Field Test are accepted on condition that the CPDC, its officials and members, and the land and horse owners, are released from all liabilities for loss, damage or injury sustained by dog, horse or person in conjunction with, or during the running of, this field test. All minors shall be under the direct care and supervision of a parent or guardian.</p>

TEST INFORMATION:

- **Courses & Birds** - Chukar partridge and/or quail will be released. The tests will be over a single course with birds released along the course. There may be a bird field. The CPDC reserves the right, in case of a bird shortage, to use alternate bird species.
- **Horses on the course** - Bird planters, marshals and judges may use horses. All other participants & spectators must be on foot. **All dogs will be handled on foot**
- **Gallery:** At the handler's discretion, a gallery of spectators may be permitted to follow the test dogs. Spectators must wear blaze orange, remain together at all times and shall follow the directions of the judges, marshal & gunners. All other spectators must remain in the camp area.
- Please be aware that all participants (handlers, judges, gunners, marshalls and gallery) who will be on course for FD, FDA or FDX (all tests with shotguns being used) are required to wear a **blaze orange outer garment** (vest/jacket/shirt) **and** required to wear **blaze orange headgear**.
- Total entries will be limited to the **number of dogs** that can be run in approximately 8 hours of judging time.
- **Starting times** will be announced. (Earliest start will be 7:00 am.) Running times are an estimate only and may change due to absentees or dogs "picked up" early. It is the handler's responsibility to be at the start of the course when it is their turn to run.
- **FDJ & FD** dogs will have **20-30 minutes** to complete all aspects of the test. **FDA** dog will have 30-40 minutes to complete all aspects of the course. **FDX** dogs will have **30-45 minutes**. Dogs will be run individually in the FDJ & FD Tests; FDA and FDX dogs will be run in braces.
- **Firearms** - Official gunners will be the only persons permitted to carry firearms on the test site. In FD, FDA & FDX, shotguns will be fired over dogs with bird work when possible. Shooting will be done by **official gunners** only. In FDJ blank shells will be fired – please **provide your own starting pistol**.
- Bitches **in season** will not be permitted to run.
- **Collaring** a dog will be allowed only at the judge's instruction.
- **Approved tracking collars** will be permitted.
- **Training or exercising** of dogs is prohibited on the test grounds during the test weekend (from Friday evening until completion of judging on Sunday).
- **Smoking** is prohibited except in the designated camping or headquarters area.
- **Accommodation:** Camping will be allowed on the grounds in the area specified. Facilities are limited, come prepared. Outhouse is provided. Cochrane Motels: Bow River Inn (932-7900), Cochrane Super 8 (932-6355), Harvest Country Inn (932-1410)
- **Food:** There will **NOT** be a concession at the grounds. Please bring your own food, snacks, water etc.
- **Prizes** - Rosettes will be awarded to all qualifying dogs. All ribbons are to be claimed at the Test – no ribbons will be mailed
- All participants must be familiar with CKC Rules and Regulations and also the rules, conditions and provisions of this Premium List. CKC Field Test Rules are available from the CKC. **NOTE: Make sure you review the rules for Field Dog Tests (available on the CKC website: www.ckc.ca)**

LOCATION

The tests will be held on the property of Jim and Sue Deyell. The club is grateful to have the use of these grounds and asks for your cooperation in keeping them free of litter by using garbage bags provided. Parking will be restricted to the marked areas. A map or directions to the grounds will be provided to participants after the draw.
