**ALL handlers, are required to check in with the Test Secretary no later than 7:30 am.**

### SOCIAL & RIBBON PRESENTATION to follow Tests

#### **General Information**

- All qualifying dogs will receive a rosette.
- Pheasants, ducks or pigeons will be used on land and ducks will be used for all water tests.
- Bitches in season shall not be eligible for entry and shall not be allowed on the grounds.
- All throwers, judges and competitors should wear dark or camouflaged clothing.
- The Alberta Field Trial Club and its members will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, BUT will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of an accident or other misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- There shall be no training of dogs on the test grounds, except for single training bumper which are thrown by hand by the handler, within 24 hours of the commencement of the event or at anytime during the event.
- Electric collars (either dummy or live) as well as prong or pinch type collars shall not be worn by any dog on the grounds at any time during the event.
- Camouflage wet suit/vest maybe worn by dog when running water tests.
- Drive only on designated roads or areas on test grounds and pick up trash.
- You are responsible for your own lunch.

**Temporary Competition Number (TCN):** Owners of unregistered CKC recognized breeds entering events are required to obtain a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). A TCN allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). Dogs not registered in Canada must obtain a TCN before submitting an entry for a hunt test. A TCN fee of \$10.50 (includes GST) must be included with your entry fees. CKC Registration or ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the hunt test or all awards will be cancelled.

## **NOTICE TO COMPETITORS AND SPECTATORS**

It shall be the duty and obligation of the test-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind. On report of the test-giving Club of an alleged indignity of any kind, the Hunt Test Committee of the Club shall forthwith conduct an investigation and shall at once render its decision to the parties concerned. It shall also, within twenty-one days after the test, report to the Canadian Kennel Club the nature of the alleged indignity, the names of the parties concerned and its findings. The Discipline Committee of The Canadian Kennel Club shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated. A copy of this rule shall be prominently placed in every premium list.

**Release and Indemnification of Landowners and Alberta Field Trial Club:** By entering this event, each participant agrees to assume all risks and hazards incidental to participation in the event and agrees to release, save harmless and indemnify the owner(s) of the property upon which the event is held, together with their agents, employees and representatives from all claims, actions, costs, expenses and demands in respect to death, injury, loss or damage to the person, dog, or property of the participant howsoever caused, arising out of or in connection with the participant's use or entry upon the property. It is understood that this agreement is binding upon the participant and all of his heirs, executors and assigns.

### **Notice to All Clubs/Exhibitors - Health Reminders**

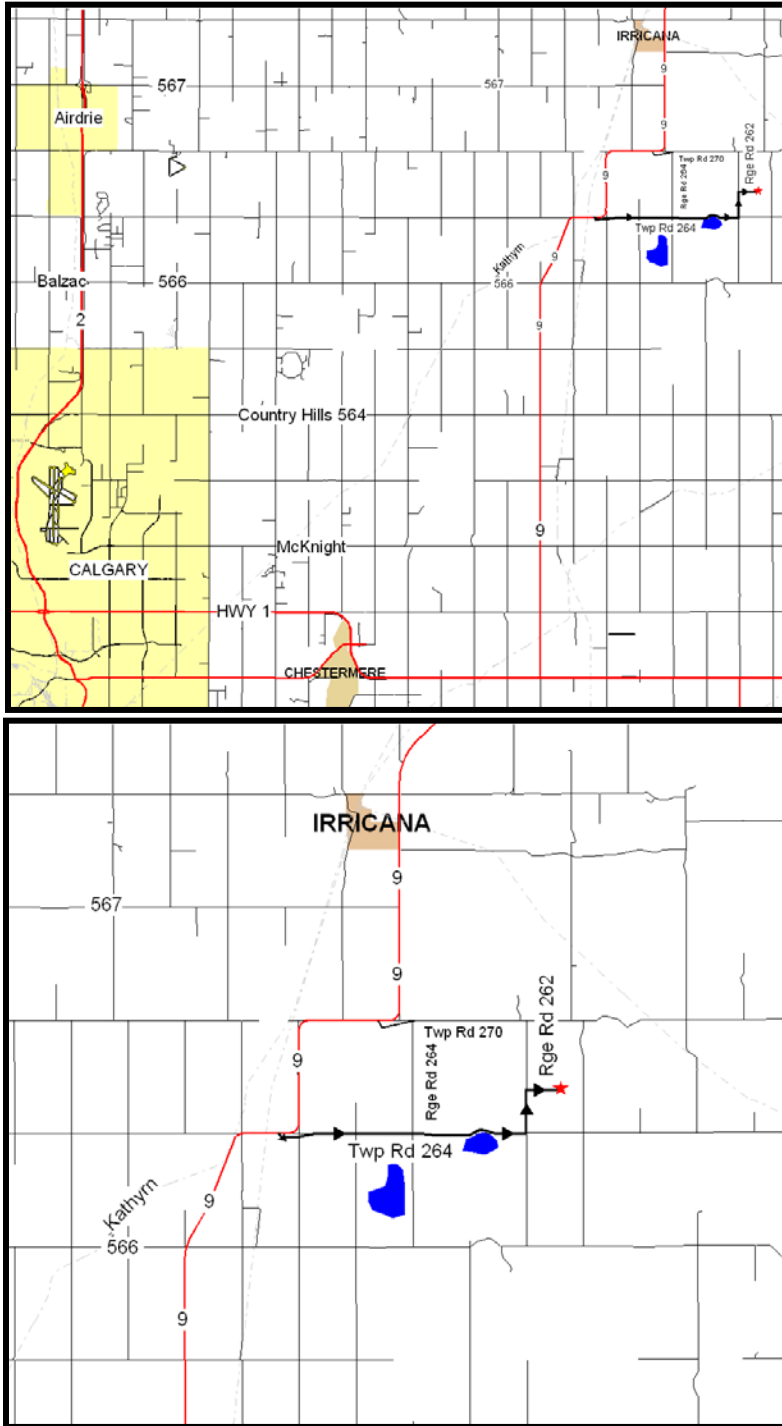
No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

**Note: Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic any Public Health restrictions for travel and social gathering at the time of the Test will dictate available spaces and or cancellation of the Test.**

**All participants are expected to comply with current COVID Public Health Guidelines for the area at the time of the test. These Guidelines will be posted and forwarded with the running order. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of your participation and entry fee.**

# Map and Directions to Bow River Retrievers (BRR) Training Grounds



**Directions:** From Hwy 9 turn south onto Twp Rd 264. The turn off is to the south and the road immediately curves east. Travel east on Twp Rd 264 for 7 km to Rge Rd 262. Turn left (north). Travel 1 km then turn right (east) at 3<sup>rd</sup> laneway from corner. You will see a big house with red and wood siding (on right) and a white and green metal barn (on left). Continue to drive past this house. **DRIVE SLOWLY.** Travel 1 km straight ahead to blue bungalow (grey shed, large grey metal barn and log cabin).
